



COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN IDAHO FORENSICS SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The College of Southern Idaho will award several thousand dollars in forensics scholarships for the 2017-2018 school year exclusively to outstanding new and returning speech and debate students at CSI. Each scholarship will pay for a portion of undergraduate resident tuition and fees for the fall and/or spring semesters. Recipients will compete with the College of Southern Idaho Collegiate Speech and Debate Team and are eligible to receive continued scholarship assistance. Selection will be based on academic promise and forensics excellence and potential. Students who are looking for a challenging and rewarding educational atmosphere are encouraged to apply regardless of prior forensics experience.

REQUIREMENTS:

- **ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN IDAHO (TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE CSI ADMISSIONS OFFICE BY MARCH 30, 2017)**
- **STUDENTS MUST COMPLETE THE GENERAL CSI SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FORM FOR 2017-2018 (TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE CSI SCHOLARSHIP OFFICE BY MARCH 30, 2017)**
- **A MINIMUM CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF 3.00 OR HIGHER ON A FOUR POINT SCALE.**

- A digital copy of the General CSI Scholarship Application Form that was submitted to the scholarship office.
- A letter of application indicating why you wish to pursue forensics at the collegiate level.
- A detailed summary of your high school competitive speaking experience including tournaments attended, events entered and awards won, if applicable. If you weren't involved in Speech and Debate, please speak to any speaking experiences you may have had (FFA, DECA).
- A letter of recommendation from someone who can speak to your strengths and weaknesses, and your potential for continued academic and forensics success in college.
- Applicants are encouraged to send additional supporting materials for consideration by the selection committee. These might include additional letters of recommendation, a videotape of a performance, and/or copies of transcripts.
